Training School Opening Nears

Operation Guyana will open a new leadership training school in Guyana when the Guyana International Bible Institute closes April 23.

Steve DeLoach, director of Operation Guyana, announced that funding for the training operation will be provided by the West-Ark Church of Christ in Fort Smith, Ark.

"We have operated a nurturing institute in Guyana for some time," DeLoach said. "Now we will shift gears and go into training new preachers, offering continuing education for current preachers and teach and train general membership to be better leaders and teachers within their own congregations."

DeLoach will be heading to the South American country in April, a month earlier than usual, to help get the school off to a quick start.

Mission teams will be heading down shortly after that and will be providing more training materials to draw on. DeLoach said the school plans to use the visitors to help teach some classes.

The school will be offered at no cost to the students and it will not offer financial support. There is already applicant school status from Sunset International Bible Institute of Lubbock, and graduates will receive degrees from there.

"We hope to offer these students a flexible training schedule, maybe offering day and night classes," DeLoach explained. "Not all the details are worked out yet, but with funding in place and the status with Sunset, we are well on our way to offering a great opportunity for training workers for God."
