That event has provided us with a tremendous opportunity for the summer. We passed out more than 60 tons of food and cleaning items and other supplies to help flood victims.

Teams will come down to a field that is more ripe for harvest than ever. The opportunity to let our light shine for Him has never been greater!

As would be expected after flooding that lasted for four weeks or more, next came spread of water-borne diseases. Many people died from those, but teams should have no fear for their safety this summer.

Several of our teams have responded to this situation by sending more people. We are expecting record numbers of participants.

One sad note, though. We lost our dear brother, Eustace Lynch, in March just before my return home.

Brother Eustace was a great help to the work in Guyana and a great help to me. He was a wonderful friend to me and my family and he will be sorely missed.

We ask you to continue to pray for us and the work in Guyana. We pray that we will recognize and take advantage of the opportunities God presents for us. Thanks to all of you who have supported this work so diligently.
